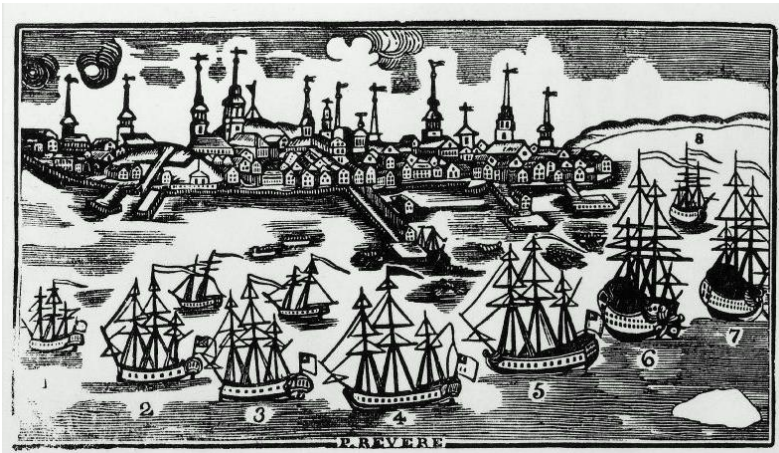

C A P. XIX.

An Act to discontinue, in such Manner, and for such Time as are therein mentioned, the landing and discharging, lading or shipping, of Goods, Wares, and Merchandise, at the Town, and within the Harbour, of *Boston*, in the Province of *Massachusetts Bay*, in *North America*.

WHEREAS dangerous Commotions and Insurrections have been fomented and raised in the Town of *Boston*, in the Province of *Massachusetts Bay*, in *New England*, by divers ill-affected Persons, to the Subversion of His Majesty's Government, and to the utter Destruction of the publick Peace, and good Order of the said Town; in which Commotions and Insurrections certain valuable Cargoes of Teas, being the Property of the East India Company, and on Board certain Vessels lying within the Bay or Harbour

C A P. XLIV.

An Act to allow a Drawback of the Duties of Customs on the Exportation of Tea to any of His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in *America*; to increase the Deposit on Bohea Tea to be sold at the *India Company's* Sales; and to empower the Commissioners of the Treasury to grant Licences to the *East India Company* to export Tea Duty-free.

WHEREAS by an Act, made in the Preamble.
 Twelfth Year of His present Majesty's
 Reign, (intituled, An Act for grant-
 ing a Drawback of Part of the Customs
 upon the Exportation of Tea to *Ireland*,
 and the *British* Dominions in *America*; for altering the

6th Amendment

In all criminal prosecutions, the accused shall enjoy the right to a speedy and public trial, by an impartial jury of the State and district wherein the crime shall have been committed, which district shall have been previously ascertained by law, and to be informed of the nature and cause of the accusation; . . .

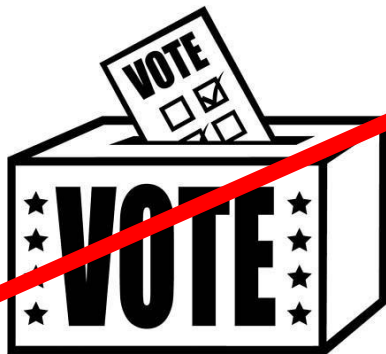
